The weighted number of respondents who reported current daily or occasional smoking of cigarettes.

Inclusions:

From CCHS derived variable called SMKDVSTY (based on SMK_005, SMK_020, SMK_025, SMK_030) has the following values:

- Variable SMKDVSTY = 1 when SMK_005 = 1;
- Variable SMKDVSTY = 2 when SMK 005 = 2;
- Variable SMKDVSTY = 3 when SMK_005 = 3 and SMK_020 = 1 and SMK_030 = 1;
- Variable SMKDVSTY = 4 when SMK_005 = 3 and SMK_020 = 1 and SMK_030 = 2;
- Variable SMKDVSTY = 5 when SMK_005 = 3 and SMK_020 = 2 and SMK_025 = 1;
- Variable SMKDVSTY = 6 when SMK 005 = 3 and SMK 020 = 2 and SMK 025 = 2;
- Variable SMKDVSTY = 99 when SMK_005 = DK, RF, NS; or when SMK_020 = DK, RF, NS; or when SMK_025 = DK, RF, NS; or when SMK_030 = DK, RF, NS.

The numerator only includes SMKDVSTY values of 1 and 2.

Denominator including inclusion/exclusion*

The weighted number of respondents aged 12 or older that responded to the survey question. Exclusions:

- The denominator of the percentages for smoking excludes non-response
- The denominator of the percentages for stratification variables exclude valid skips and non-response

Caveats and Limitations
